DIFFERENT by DESIGN

Every child deserves a chance to be educated in the way he or she was designed to learn. At Oaks Christian, we have created a unique model that addresses the whole child - body, mind, heart, and soul. Our primary goal is to foster in each child an authentic love for learning. When students leave our campus, they are equipped to do so much more than memorize facts and pass tests. They are confident in their abilities to think for themselves, create with their own two hands, and use their God-given skills to impact the world.

We accomplish this by:

Embracing experiential learning

Students learn best when they learn by doing. Hands-on projects and an emphasis on subject to subject integration allow students to connect concepts to the real world, retain information more fully, and experience gratification in the learning process. Our experiential learning model allows us to engage all three learning styles (auditory, visual, and kinesthetic).

Avoiding screen dependence

21st-century learning is all about innovation and creativity. Unfortunately, screen dependency can hinder these skills, especially for young students. Screen-free education in the elementary years has proven social and psychological benefits, and allows students to become critical thinkers and persistent learners.

Assigning little to no homework

When students are at school all day and come home to hours of homework, they miss out on opportunities for social and emotional development. Free time to play, socialization with family and friends, and adequate rest are essential for young learners. We make sure your kids get to be kids, and any assigned homework is intentionally light, relevant and practical.

Shortening the school day

We're all about honoring and redeeming childhood. Our schedule is 8:30 a.m.-2.40 p.m., which is about 1.5 hours shorter than the traditional school day. This provides more time for students to be outdoors, spend time with family, and learn through play.

Offering a year-round schedule

Research shows that when students attend school year-round, they enjoy a better rhythm in their lives, avoid regression commonly referred to as the "summer slide," and remain energized throughout the school year. Students at Oaks Christian enjoy short breaks every few weeks, an extended Christmas break, and a one month break in July.

Allowing teachers to shine in their areas of expertise

Unlike other elementary schools where one teacher provides instruction across all core subject areas, students at Oaks Christian rotate through different learning environments. This enhances student engagement and allows teachers to focus on a subject they love and dive more deeply into their content with passion and enthusiasm.

Intentionally mentoring every student

At Oaks Christian, each student is paired with a Homeroom Shepherd (HRS), a faculty member dedicated to the holistic development of each student. The HRS advocates for students, knows how each child learns, and understands their strengths and weaknesses. Each HRS works closely with the teachers to help meet the individual education needs of the students.

Being Christ-centered

At Oaks Christian, children experience the joy of discovering God's Truth in all subject areas. God and the Bible are not merely relegated to a lesson plan, but rather, are the lens in which they view the world.

WHY CHRISTIAN EDUCATION?

Being a Christian school means more to us than offering a Bible class or a worship hour. It's about a commitment to nurture the whole child. From kindergarten through fifth grade, students at Oaks Christian School will build a foundation for life and learning. 
A STRONG START: KINDERGARTEN

Kindergarten sets the stage for your child's educational journey. During this everimportant year, students experience rapid growth — academically, socially, emotionally, and spiritually. Their natural curiosity and drive makes it a prime time to maximize their learning through age-appropriate, handson projects. Students may feel like they're playing, but we know they're building a foundation for lifelong learning.

A Day in the Life

Wondering what your child's day will look like in kindergarten? Here's a sample schedule from one of our teachers:

BEFORE MORNING CLASSES: The Gathering

The Gathering is a time to learn about God and His word. Students sing songs, discuss the Bible, and learn about the basic tenets of the Christian faith.

MORNING CLASSES: Core Subjects

Reading, Writing, and Math encompass three of the core subject areas. Each hour-long class actively engages students in purposeful and intentional play and experiential learning that includes critical thinking, problem solving, and hands-on student-centered activities. You will often find students working with manipulatives on the floor or in flexible seating while learning.

LUNCH: Students eat lunch together and enjoy visiting with their friends.

AFTERNOON CLASSES: Core and Enrichment Classes

Social Studies and Science classes are interactive and engaging. Students can often be found conducting science experiments or learning and experiencing different cultures through dramatic play. Enrichment classes serve to add depth to the already robust learning of the day.



THE VALUE of CONTINUITY in ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

In grades 1-5, students dive deeper into the core subject areas and discover their unique passions through special subjects and extracurricular activities. Mastering this wide variety of skills requires continuity. At Oaks Christian School, students have the same teachers for three consecutive years per subject area, and move seamlessly from one grade to the next.

These teachers collaborate closely to ensure they are helping students make valuable connections and build upon what they've already learned. With small class sizes, they have the opportunity to invest in each child's unique educational journey, knowing their learning styles and meeting them where they are each day.

Our teachers are living curriculum. They choose the best tools and resources based on their subject expertise and apply them to the specific learning framework of each group of students.

80% of class time is spent on teacher-initiated/lead engaging, hands-on activities. Only 20% is teacher-directed/instruction.

Complete and Submit **Educational Testing and** Required Forms


> Schedule your child's testing with an educational psychologist (more info on our website), have your physician complete the medical form, and ask your child's teacher to complete the recommendation form.

Schedule Your Student Visit

Once we receive your application, we will reach out to you to schedule your child's visit. For rising kindergarten students, the visit is approximately two hours and includes fun assessment activities and a snack with our kindergarten class. Students in grades 1-5 will have a full-day visit and will experience classroom life at Oaks Christian School.

Admissions Decision/ Enrollment

> When all the steps in the admissions process have been completed, the admissions committee will make an admissions decision. and you will be contacted. Upon acceptance, you will receive a formal letter with information about how to register and set up a tuition payment plan.





How old must my child be to attend?

Kindergarten applicants should be five years old by August 1 of the academic year in which they plan to start school.

Are you open to families from other faiths?

Certainly! While we are a Christian school, we welcome families from all backgrounds and traditions. We believe the Christian character values we aim to teach are universally appreciated by families of different faiths.

My child has an IEP. Can she attend Oaks Christian?

It is our mission to serve every student with excellence. Currently, we are not set up to meet the needs of students with specific, diagnosed learning differences. We understand that no two students are the same, and we would be glad to answer your questions.

Is transportation available?

Oaks Christian does not offer transportation at this time; however, many of our families carpool.
